Next Steps:

Consider the ramifications of Jesus saying, "I am thirsty" as recorded by John 19:28-29. What do these simple words say about Jesus?

Why was it important for Jesus to proclaim His thirst? Psalm 69:20-21 & Hebrews 4:15

What does Philippians 2:1-11 say about Jesus being fully God and fully human? What does this passage teach us about how we should relate to other people?

John mentions the soldiers used "a stalk of hyssop plant" to help quench the thirst of Jesus. Why would it be important to mention hyssop according to Exodus 12:21-27 & Psalm 51?

In John 19:30 Jesus says, "It is finished." What is "finished?" Matthew, Mark & Luke record the "curtain of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom?" Why is this important? What did "the curtain represent?" What does this mean for you? Matthew 27:51, Mark 15:38 & Luke 23:45

Read John 7:37-38. What are you thirsty for? To whom do we go to quench your thirst? What should result after your thirst is quenched?

Next Week: Next Sunday is commonly known as "Palm Sunday." It is the day when the crowds gathered to celebrate Jesus triumphantly entering Jerusalem... on a donkey. Just a few days later all the cheering crowds would call for His crucifixion. On the cross Jesus says these last words found in Luke 23:44-49.
